Dear Ms. Isaacs:

I am writing in response to your letter dated July 10, 2014. Our respective clients have very different perceptions of what has been going on in the home and each other's behavior. According to Mr. [REDACTED] your client's allegations are not true and it is Ms. [REDACTED] who is acting in a harassing and childish manner. Ms. [REDACTED] has been keeping the lights on and making loud noises in order to make it difficult for Mr. [REDACTED] to sleep. Your client then inexplicably called the police to report a total non-event that was, if anything, instigated by her. The police confirmed that there was no issue, that the dispute between the parties was not a police matter, and instructed her that she should not call again for such frivolous complaints.

I am sure that you are aware that even if Ms. [REDACTED] allegations about my client's conduct were true, they would not even remotely constitute acts entitling her to a restraining order under the Domestic Violence Act. Threatening a DV Complaint when Ms. [REDACTED] only complaint is that Mr. Cambiotis allegedly plays the TV too loud is not going to give your client any perceived "leverage" in this litigation and we both know that if she were to proceed, Ms. [REDACTED] would be unwisely wasting the Court's time on an application that would be summarily dismissed. Rather than increase the tension by making such threats, let's work towards helping
